The year 2019 is off to a great start for B8 of Hope!

Here is an update of all the actions that the B8 of Hope team undertook in the first half of the year.

The Gala was a success!

The B8 of Hope team is pleased to announce that the Gala was a huge success!

The Intercontinental Hotel helped us host 450 participants in Geneva on March 11th, 2019 for a wonderful evening. The audience was marvelously diverse, bringing together Jews and Arabs from the diasporas, international expats and Swiss locals, all united around the fundamental message of peace and non-violence that B8 of Hope promotes.

The evening was a real emotional rollercoaster. The Iranian American stand-up comedian, Maz Jobrani, made us laugh to tears, whilst the activists Raz Kones (Israeli), Yara Amayra (Palestinian) and Huda Abuarquob (regional director of Alliance for Middle East Peace) moved us to tears. These thrills and emotions really made us feel as if we were at a family gathering... The family of B8 of Hope.

Thanks to all the businesses and private individuals who contributed to our tombola and auction items, we were able to raise funds that were used to support our ongoing projects – Roots, Taghyeer, Women Wage Peace, Combatants for Peace, Karama Center, A Land for All, Saving the Children Program (Peres Center for Peace), as well as broaden our pool to a few newcomers: Jerusalem Youth Chorus, The Road to Recovery, and Tech2Peace.

Screenings

In these past few months, B8 of Hope continued contributing to the production and screenings of Israeli and Palestinian peace activists' movies by sponsoring them.

B8 of Hope collaborated with the association <u>Giving Women</u> in April, on the occasion of their 10th anniversary, to organise a screening of the documentary "<u>Les Guerrières de la Paix</u>" by Hanna Assouline, in Geneva, in the presence of the Palestinian activist, and protagonist of the movie, Yara Amayra, who gave a speech to the audience at the house of Atalanti Moquette, founder of Giving Women.

In May, B8 of Hope sponsored the screening of "*The Field*" at the International Oriental Film festival, with the collaboration of Cercle Martin Buber and JCall. "*The Field*" recounts the story of the beginnings of Roots. The film director, Mordechai Vardi, replied to the questions

of the public after the screening.

Trip on the Ground

Mehra Rimer went on one of her regular Israel-Palestine trip in May to attend the **Alternative Memorial Ceremony** by Combatants for Peace and Parents Circle Families Forum (PCFF), which B8 of Hope sponsored for the past two years.

In this highly moving ceremony, Israeli and Palestinian families united in Tel Aviv to pay tribute to members of their families who fell during the conflict. This ceremony was launched 14 years ago, with only 50 people. This year, they were 9,000.

Rav Hanan Schlesinger, co-founder of Roots, who accompanied Mehra to the ceremony, wrote a deeply touching <u>article</u> about it.

The Jerusalem Youth Chorus in Geneva

On June 28th, a group of 26 young Israeli and Palestinian singers from the Jerusalem Youth Chorus arrived in Lausanne, in a partnership with the <u>association Coexistences</u>. These singers are participating to one of Coexistences' bridge-building programs in Lausanne and will sing at the United Nations in Geneva on July 3rd.

Two of our interns, Parker and Ilona, were present in Lausanne to welcome the group in a park, where they sang and met their host families around a delicious picnic.

The high-light of the lftars for us was the visit of our Swiss Ambassador Jean-Daniel Ruch. Some members of Roots joined the dinner as well as the Danish Ambassador and other friends of the Abu Awwad family.
